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Team Facilitator Training 2.0 Northeast Regional CAC	Team Facilitator Training (TFT) 2.0 is a 2.5-day, live virtual training that is a more intensive training offered to experienced team facilitators. The focus of the training is on enhancing the participants' team facilitation skills so they can continue to build team relationships, sustain a positive team culture, and lead a high functioning MDT. This training is open to TFs working in the Northeast region. Seating is limited to a maximum of 20 participants for each learning cohort. Applications are required. Peer Support Regional CACs	The MDT Facilitator Peer Forum is a quarterly, virtual opportunity to connect with peers across the country who are facilitating MDTs. Each forum starts in a large-group format to review a topic related to MDT facilitation, and then participants are placed in Zoom breakout rooms for self-facilitated, small-group discussions and resource sharing. At the end, participants are brought back together in one large group for a Q&A with regional staff.
