In this training, participants will: • Understand the MDT facilitator's role in aligning the team with the CAC/MDT model. • Understand how to build foundations for team success by defining team mission, vision, and purpose. • Appreciate the importance of formally onboarding new team members. • Understand stages of team development and key concepts for team resilience. • Recognize sources of bias and identify strategies for mitigating it. • Practice building powerful questions for increased dialogue and conflict resolution.
