





MULTIDISCIPLINARY TEAM FACILITATOR TRAINING GUIDE - 2022





<p>Leading Engaged Teams</p> <p><i>Midwest Regional CAC</i></p> <p><i>Western Regional CAC</i></p>	<p>Leading Engaged Teams is a 2.5-day, in-person training designed for CAC staff or team members responsible for coordination/ leadership of the CAC's MDT who wish to enhance their skills as facilitators and leaders and improve ongoing team communication, accountability and relationships.
